2012/13 WRITER RESIDENCY APPLICATION

WHAT IS A RESIDENCY?

Artist residencies (also called artists' communities, colonies, retreats, workspaces, and studio collectives) provide dedicated time and space for creative work. Beyond this core value, these creative communities are a diverse group, and provide artists of all disciplines with many different styles and models of support.

Residencies can be found in urban or rural areas, serving one artist at a time or fifty. Some support one artistic genre while many are interdisciplinary, welcoming visual artists, writers, composers, choreographers, scholars and other creative individuals. There are programs that are active centers for public programs and others that offer solitude and retreat. Many provide room and board as a home-away-from-home; others offer not a place to live, but a community for local artists in which to work and be supported in the creation of new art.

HILL HOUSE EXPERIENCE

The **Hill House Artist Residency** supports writers at all stages of their careers. We offer a two, three or four week stay in a semi-secluded log cabin with a well stocked kitchen near East Jordan, Michigan. The residency also offers opportunities for community exchange through performance, readings or workshops.

Writers age 21 and older from anywhere in the world may apply. Solo writers as well as writing teams of up to four people may apply (but note the accommodation information below).

RESIDENCY LENGTH

The residency lasts a minimum of two and a maximum of four weeks. Residencies typically start on Wednesday and end on Monday.

COST

The application fee is \$20 *per application period*, which represents about 3% of the total cost of your residency. We charge an additional processing fee of \$5 for non-digital applications. While there are no other costs to you, you will still need money for incidentals, materials and transportation to and from the residency (with two exceptions: we are able to transport you to and from either Cherry Capitol Airport in Traverse City or the bus station in Mancelona). Also consider indirect costs: time away from your job and paying bills at home while you are in residence.

COMMUNITY, GEOGRAPHY AND CLIMATE

East Jordan is a small town near the 45th parallel in Northwest Lower Michigan, about an hour's drive from Traverse City. The Hill House is located on a back road near the Mackinaw State Forest, about a 15 minute drive from the Villages of East Jordan, Mancelona and Bellaire. The State Forest offers exceptional opportunities for canoeing, hiking, bird watching, morel hunting and fishing, while nearby towns offer art galleries, microbreweries, parks and dining. Expect a quiet, isolated space punctuated by loon calls and the occasional coyote howl. Hunters take to the woods in November.

Michigan weather can be a surprise for those accustomed to more temperate climates. Winter temperatures can drop well below 0° F (-18° C) and are accompanied by massive snowfall. Appropriate clothing is required: heavy winter coats, thermal underwear and stout snow boots are mandatory. Conversely, summer temperatures can climb above 90° F (32° C) accompanied by high humidity. Creek and lake dipping are the best strategies for beating the heat.

The area offers very little in terms of public transportation. A car is required to get to town. In the thick of winter, however, a car without 4WD may not be able to navigate the steep road to the house. In that case, we can assist in moving your things in and out of the space, but you may still need to walk a hundred yards or so to a separate parking area during the deepest snowfall (Dec to Feb, typically). This winter residency is for the hardy!

You have the opportunity to create your own level of engagement with the community. If you desire four weeks of total solitude, it's yours. If you'd prefer to have dinner or drinks with ISLAND staff and area artists, we can arrange that too. You can spend a weekend touring local galleries and watching live music, or you can sit on the back porch and not speak to a soul. It's your choice, but keep in mind that community engagement will require more energy on your part; solitude comes naturally here.

LIVING ENVIRONMENT

The Hill House is a two story log cabin. It has two bedrooms, two bathrooms, a large unfinished basement, a spacious back porch, a washer and dryer, electric heat and a fireplace. The Hill House can potentially accommodate up to four people at one time (one queen-sized bed, two single beds and one pull-out couch). The house is not ADA compliant, and is not accessible by wheelchair.

We love good food. We make every effort to fulfill your dietary desires while focusing on fresh, local, seasonal and organic food whenever possible. We are happy to include local pastured meat and poultry, and we are also vegetarian and vegan friendly. Access to fresh local food tends to be easier in the summer and fall and more challenging in the winter and early spring. We stock the kitchen, but for the most part you are on your own for meal preparation, so it helps if you have a little cooking skill. If all you want is a freezer filled with pizzas and bean burritos, we can do that too.

A phone is available for local calls. Not all cell phones receive service here. Wireless internet access is available, but the house does not come with a computer. *Smoking is not permitted on the property.* One dog or cat is allowed but must be leashed when outdoors. No exceptions to these rules, sorry!

WORKSPACE

No particular room is designated as a work space. You're free to take over the house in whatever way best works for your creativity. Residents should bring the materials they need to work. A printer and paper are available for your use.

PREPARING TO APPLY

WHO SHOULD APPLY

Writers at all stages of their careers may apply. Writers in all fields may apply. Your application will be weighed on the quality of your submitted writing.

If you have not applied for a residency before, consider your readiness for this experience. You should be prepared to focus on your art in an isolated space. Is this the kind of experience that will help you relax and work, or will a lone cabin in the woods drive you crazy? There are hundreds of residency programs out there—be sure this is the right one for you.

WORK SAMPLES

Your work samples (in this case, ten to twenty pages of your best writing) are by far the most important part of your application. **Only submit your best work.** Better to send just ten great pages than twenty pages of mixed quality work. Remember, you are one of hundreds of applicants and the selection panel will be reading thousands of pages of submissions. Do everything in your power to make sure your work stands out.

It's hard to judge your own work, so get feedback from people whose artistic opinions you respect by asking them to read your submission. Many schools have career development offices that are available to students, faculty, staff, and alumni, to assist you in putting together a strong application.

ARTIST STATEMENT

Your artist statement should be coherent and brief, not a lengthy, esoteric manifesto of your soul. It is a way to communicate your creative practice and your artistic approach.

REFERENCES

Avoid providing references who have an impressive reputation but who don't really know you. We are interested in your seriousness as an artist, your dedication to a creative practice and your readiness for a residency program. Ask your references to speak to these points, rather than simply tell us what a wonderful writer you are!

APPLICATION PERIODS

There are three application periods for the 2012/13 residency season. You can apply for any or all application periods, and should first decide which dates you are available to attend. The more flexible your availability, the more likely we can accommodate you and the greater the chances your application will be accepted.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Your application will be juried by a rotating panel selected by ISLAND. Residency awards are merit driven, using the following criteria, in order of priority:

- **the creativity and integrity of the work**
- **the strength of the artist's statement and the perceived fit with the Hill House residency**
- **the availability of the artist in the dates still open for residents**

You may submit your work digitally (.DOC .RTF .TXT or .PDF) via email to amanda@artmeetsearth.org, or for \$5 you may mail printed pages to: **ISLAND attn: Hill House Residency, 5870 Cottage Drive, Bellaire, MI 49615**. There is no restriction on how you choose to package your work. You may submit photocopies or scans of published material, whole zines (if you are the sole author) or photos of writing-based art pieces. Just remember that submissions must total less than 20 pages and be entirely your original work. If you have any questions about how to submit non-traditional work, please don't hesitate to contact Amanda Kik at amanda@artmeetsearth.org. Application entries will not be returned.

COMPLETE THE ARTIST STATEMENT

On a separate page, briefly tell us about yourself—your bio, your writing, and why a residency program would benefit you. **If you have been to a residency before, tell us where and when.** No more than 600 words total.
